



The International Renuka Ji Fair is celebrated every year in the first fortnight of November (after 10 days of Diwali). Dance, Music, Local dancer Kariyala, Shopping markets, Exhibitions, and many other programs are organized on the banks of Renuka Lake. Processions of five local deities visit the Devi's temple during the fair. On the first day the idol of Parshuram is taken in a decorated silver palanquin from the Jamu village to the banks of the Giri River. The other local deities reach the spot before he does, together they go to the site of the fair and then festivities continue. The belief is that to meet his mother, Parshuram visits the lake at the time when the fair is held.




The Chintpurni fair, locally known as 'Mata Da Mela' (fair of the mother Goddess) is held in village Chintpurni on a spur of the hill range of the same name, about 3 kms. to the west of Bharwain. The fair which has been held since time immemorial, takes place thrice a year in the month of Chaitra (March-April), Sawan (July-August) and Ashwin (September-October). In Chaitra and Ashwin, the fair is held in Navratras whereas in Sawan it takes place during the first ten days of Shukla Paksha i.e. the bright half of the lunar month.






The tribal Phulaich festival- the festival of flowers also known by Okayand and Ukyang in the local dialect is held in the month of September in particular. The 16th day of the Hindu month of 'Bhadraprada' marks the onset of the Phulaich festival .It is a time when the valley is adorned with dotted flowers. Drums are played and bugles are also blown to greet and salute the heroic team that climbs up the hill top to accumulate the flowers. Villagers carry weapons to depict and display the ancient war scenes that they perform during the fair. It all happens amidst the procession surrounded by gold & silver idols of the local deities in colorful traditional attires.



Minjar Mela is celebrated in Chamba valley of Himachal Pradesh as a commemoration of the victory of the Raja of Chamba over the ruler of Kangra in 935 AD. It is said that on the return of their victorious king, people greeted him with sheaf of paddy and maize as gift to symbolize prosperity and happiness. This mela is held on the second Sunday of the Shravana month. The fair is announced by distribution of Minjar, which is a silk tassel worn on some parts of the dress by men and women alike. This tassel symbolizes the shoots of paddy and maize which make their appearance around this time of the year. The week long fair begins when the Minjar flag is hoisted in historical Chowgan.






International Kullu Dussehra, a weeklong festival, is one of the important festivals of India. Started in the 17th century, the tradition was established when Raja Jagat Singh installed an idol of Lord Raghunath that had been brought from Ayodhya at the palace temple in Kullu. Celebrated with great fanfare, more than 300 deities/'Devtas' of Kullu district participate and pay their obeisance to Lord Shri Raghunath ji, the Principal deity of Kullu valley. The festival gets underway with the arrival of Goddess Hadimba from Manali, but the main function is that of the Lord Raghunath, colourfully dressed, riding into the ground in a hand pulled wooden chariot. The local Administration invites the deities to participate in the festival. During the festival, Rath Yatra, exhibitions put up by various Govt. Departments and NGO's, sports meet and local marts displaying handicrafts and other local products etc. are the major attraction of the festival.



Lavi fair of Rampur is the most important fair held every year in the district Shimla of the State of Himachal Pradesh. It is a commercial fair held on the 25th of Hindu Calendar month Kartika. The fair is held for four days and has been accorded an international fair status. It is said that the fair was related to the signing of trade treaty between the erstwhile Bushahr State and Tibet. The shepherds of Kinnaur migrate to warmer places before the onset of winter and on their way they halt at Rampur. The woolen goods, dry fruits and medicinal herbs brought by them are purchased by the people and the traders of the plains and food grains, clothes and utensils are sold. It is a very old fair and entirely related to the sale and purchase of goods. 'Natti' dances and cultural shows are the main attractions of the fair.






